

EXODUS CHAPTER 35

- * Town of Bazrah – the former Babylon. The sons of Moses: Gershom and Eliezer.
- * Advice of Jethro: deputize men; divide responsibilities. Theocratic with participatory government.

EXODUS CH. 32

- the Lord reveals to Moses Israel's apostasy.
- vs. 1-9 – made a golden calf
 - v. 9 – judgment of God to the people.
 - V. 10 – “consume” – divine judgment
 - Vs. 11-14 – the love of Moses to the people
 - V. 13 – the Lord listened to Moses not because of Moses' voice but because of the truth.

NOTE: The promises of God are never hindered by the acts of men (base on grace and Attached to God's eternal covenant).

- Moses' pleading to God – 1 John 2:1-3 (advocate – defense lawyer). Jesus Christ defends us against the accusation of Satan.
- * forgiven position ally – past, present/future
- * forgiven practically – daily cleansing
- forgiveness does not abolish chastening and reaping (Hebrews 12).
- Moses' disciplinary judgment against God's people (pounded the golden calf and was mixed water and forced the offenders to drink the water).
- Throwing of tablets of laws – the temper of Moses was seen here but still, he is considered as the meekest man in the world.
- Vs. 15-29 – Anger of Moses
- Aaron – soft and very compromising that is why he did not become the next leader.
- What kind of a leader is Moses?
- Sons of Levi – preachers
 - v. 32 – the love of Moses to his people. He is compassionate but firm in leadership.
- A leader who is firm but without compassion is a tyrant.
- Ch. 33:10-11: The friendship of Moses with God.
 - Ch. 34:35 – face of Moses shone after talking with God. In this chapter, the second set of tables of the Laws were given.

Note: 16 – Attribute - Moses' face shone only reminds us Christians that the glory of God must be reflected in our lives for God to use us.

Chapter 35: The Lord gave the commandments towards the tabernacle.

- Sabbath is only given to the Israelites – OT
- Sunday – NT Dispensation

17. How is the Tabernacle worship started

1. worship in the day I told you
2. give – vs. 1-6 – gifts of the people.
*vs. 30-35 – appointed 2 men that will serve as architect and engineer (Bisaleel and Hur).

Chapter 36: all have been given by the people, the people brought much more than enough.

18. THINGS MADE

1. Coverings – curtains (v.8) – linen (Men were the ones who worked in the tabernacle).
 - v. 8 – wise hearted meaning skilled men
 - v. 19 – goats hair, ram's skin, badgers – why skin of these animals, because they are water proof.
2. Boards – v. 20 – acacia wood or shittim (overlaid with gold – v. 34).
3. Veils – vs. 35-38 – blue, purple, scarlet
4. Ark of the covenant – ch. 37:1 (why gold? Because it is the best metal, most durable and they never rust).

3 things in the ark:

- a. tablets of stones
- b. cane of Aaron which budded
- c. a golden pot of manna

5. Mercy seat – vs. 6-9 – on top of the ark of the covenant. Ark imply safety and type of Christ's salvation and security.

- Cherubims – a kind of angels serve as guardians of God.

- Going back to the 3 things in the ark of the covenant:

1. Law – points the way of going
2. Mannah – truth for knowing
3. Aaron's bud – eternal life

6. Table of Shew Bread – vs. 10-16. why call it so? Because in this table are the 12 loaves of unleaven bread
 - Bread is the type of Jesus Christ
 - 12 represent the 12 tribes of Israel (John 6:48)

7. Golden candle stick – vs. 17-24
 - picture of Christ – Light of the World (John 8:12)
 - it has 6 branches

8. Altar of incense – vs. 25-28
 - perfumes the whole inner tabernacle.Incense – sweet – smelling savor to God.
Sweet fragrance to God and not to men.
